By now, most of you have heard that the EBARC station was broken into this month. Fortunately the loss was limited to our two generator sets used for Field Day and some damage to the door. None of the radio equipment was taken or damaged. Texx, KG6ATH; who discovered the break-in. Stanton, KD6SWU; and Randy, KA6BQF. took quick action to secure the remaining equipment and repair the door. Some of the loss may be covered by insurance, and Texx thinks he has located a generator set for the June Field Day. Some of you may know the feeling that comes after you have been a burglary victim. However, nothing more could have been done to protect the station. Bad Stuff Happens.

I have been in contact with Keith Jabari of Richmond Parks and Recreation again this month about the future of our station. While the city and Parks Department have no problem with EBARC continuing to occupy the Annex Buildings, and although they are persuaded that an Amateur Radio Facility is useful and desirable within the Parks and Recreation program, they are convinced that the two buildings at 3200 MacDonald Ave. will

have to be removed sometime within two years Their choice of a location for our club station, however, may not be satisfactory. One site that has been considered is within the new Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Center on Harbor Way near Cutting Ave which is scheduled for completion next year.

So EBARC may have a choice to make in the future about the location of our station. This would be a good time to start searching for possible new homes. So if you know of a business or organization that would like to sponsor us or provide some room for equipment and antennas, we should get into some discussion with them. We will either have to accept what is offered by the city, find ourselves a new home, or consider becoming a club without a station. It's time for some optimism. 73. Ken.
